

Christina Tobias-Nahi has been at the helm of Public Affairs for Islamic Relief USA from 2006-2011 and again from 2014-2019. During her sabbatical away, she worked on an orphans and nutrition project for JCICS and managed the program TechGirls, a summer program of the U.S. State Department bringing emerging female leaders from the Middle East and North Africa to DC for leadership training.

With a special interest in refugees, in 2016 Christina partook in an interfaith, interagency team trip to Jordan, Lebanon, and Turkey. In fall of 2018, she similarly visited Moria camp in Lesbos, Greece. She has utilized platforms such as UN Habitat III, the Conference on World Affairs, and the G20 Interfaith Summit (Buenos Aires) to speak about the refugee crisis.

Christina holds a post-graduate certificate in Community-Based Development and an M.A. in International Relations from Boston University-Paris, where she spent two years working in Paris for the OECD. She then obtained her Ed.M. from the Harvard Graduate School of Education and worked at Harvard for nearly a decade with the Islamic Legal Studies Program and the Civil Rights Project before relocating to DC.
